The products are currently being used by clients as an Enterprise Search, Classification, and Taxonomy Solution; as a Call Center tool; to identify unknown Personally Identifiable Information (PII) and Protected Health Information (PHI) data exposures; in Records Management; in eDiscovery and litigation support; and to identify human capital resources and expertise within an enterprise. The software is fully integrated with Microsoft™ SharePoint but utilizes SOA compliant Web Services architecture to support applications developed on any platform.
